School Absence Text Messages

A reminder that education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

The Importance of arriving to school and class on time: Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day, helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine, give students time to greet their friends before class, reduces classroom disruption.

What if my child has to be away from school? Following an absence from school you must respond to the text message that is sent to you from our attendance system within 7 days of receiving it. Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified.

The Turtles' class have been actively engaging in fundamental gross motor skills activities as part of our sports curriculum this term. From running to throwing, catching, bouncing and skipping these activities are vital for your child's physical development.

Mastering these skills at an early age lays the groundwork for a lifetime of physical activity and overall well-being. 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Safety Reminder for School Pick Up and Drop Off

- When dropping your child off at school it is extremely important that you park on the school side of the road.
- Park safely, even if it means walking further to the school gate.
- Never park in front of the school gate.
- Give way to pedestrians on the driveway.
- Make sure your child uses the 'Safety Door' (rear kerbside door) to get in and out of the car.
- Avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as u-turns and three-point turns.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Always give way to buses pulling out.
