What a jam packed two days Fernleigh students had at the Sunshine Coast last week. With a successful departure, leaving early Tuesday morning our first destination was the Buderim Ginger Factory. Not only did we learn about growing and processing ginger in the factory, we enjoyed a train ride, a little boat ride full of surprises, ate ginger ice cream and enjoyed a lovely lunch.

Our students ... and teachers then strapped into a harness to tackle the high ropes at Maroochydore where we certainly did challenge ourselves. It was typical Fernleigh spirit where we encouraged and cheered for each other, while some tiptoed through it, others overcame fears and literally scaled new heights.

We ended the day by settling into the 'Sea Life Aquarium', where we had the whole place to ourselves. We were spoilt with private tours, having the opportunity to pat some of the sea life (not the scary ones) which included gentle creatures like starfish and sea cucumbers.

One of the highlights was being taken behind the scenes to the shark, stingray and turtle tanks. There we learned about the incredible work done to rehabilitate sick and injured turtles seeing first hand how these marine animals are cared for and we gained an understanding of the inner workings of the aquarium. We were also mesmerised by the colourful glow in the dark Jellyfish that danced for us.

After a Pizza dinner, which only touched the sides, we all eagerly set up our beds in the aquarium tunnel where the stingrays, sharks, and fish swam peacefully above us. We wondered if they were as fascinated by us as we were of them. As we lay down gazing above us, some nodded off straight away, others took the mighty tour to the toilets more than once, some needed a riveting story from Mrs G, a back pat from Mrs Reid or a little more time to spy the creatures above. In the end we did get some sleep and were up bright and early at 6am ready to pack up, have breakfast and enjoy more of the aquarium. On our morning tour we had time to watch the cute little penguins and learn about their habits and feeding. We were also delighted to meet Salty the Seal and get up close to receive a wave where he showed off his skills of walking up stairs and dancing.

Our last destination was Australia Zoo and crikey wasn't it a great morning of activity and admiration of the different animals. Ocka the cockatoo was a real crack up with his impersonations, Dougal the koala was soft and quiet and Spikey the echidna was not as spikey to touch as we thought. The kangaroos really didn't want our food at all and took off at the sight of us but we continued on to watch the magnificent tigers and elephants, and lastly we were amazed at the crocodile and bird show.

Once we were all accounted for and our legs had come to a stop, we hopped back on the bus for the very long journey home. However with music bopping, some karaoke, more stories and road trip games our journey back home was full of fun and laughter.
