Term Two has been a very busy and exciting time in the Turtles Room! We have been exploring a wide range of learning experiences that have sparked curiosity, creativity, and connection across all areas of our day. The students have settled in beautifully, and we are excited to welcome three new friends—Eli, Zev and Bjorn—who have joined our class. It has been lovely to see everyone making them feel right at home as we dive into a new term of learning and fun.

In English, we have been diving into the magical world of fairy tales. The children have really enjoyed retelling classic stories like Little Red Riding Hood and Jack and the Beanstalk, imagining how those characters and settings might look in the world today. More recently, they have been working hard on writing their very own fairy tales, filled with creativity, imagination, and plenty of personal flair!

In Science, our focus this term has been on The Living World. We have been learning about animals, life cycles, and the features that make something alive. There is lots of excitement building for our upcoming excursion to the Byron Bay Wildlife Sanctuary, where we will have the chance to see and learn about these living creatures up close, and build on everything we have been discovering in class.

In Art, we have been exploring the theme of living things, and created our own interpretation of the Big Bad Wolf enjoying the moonlight. We experimented with shadowing techniques, learning how to use contrast and detail to create mood and depth in our work.

Talk Time continues to be a much loved part of our weekly routine. It provides a special opportunity for the children to share meaningful stories, special items, and their own personal connections to The Living World. These moments help us learn more about one another and strengthen our sense of community in the classroom.

A fun and exciting new part of our timetable this term has been the Amplify Music Program, which the children have absolutely loved! They have been learning about beat, rhythm and pitch exploring the different elements of music through singing, listening, using instruments and moving to a wide range of songs. It has been a joyful and energetic addition to our week.







Whales Classroom

The Whales are blitzing through term 2, taking everything in their stride. It has been lovely welcoming Kahana into our class with her wonderful personality and knowledge. 




Patterns of lateness can have a serious impact on your child's education.

A special shout-out to all the wonderful parents who gave their time to help set up, serve, and pack down. It's this kind of community spirit that makes our school such a special place.






P&C Update – 2025 Office Bearers

Student safety is our priority and to ensure a smooth and safe drop-off and pick-up experience, please follow these important car park guidelines and share with all relevant parents, grandparents and carers. Your cooperation helps us keep every student safe. Thank you!

Car Park Entry

Enter the car park from the southern end (see attached map).

Parking Instructions

- Park your vehicle safely in the designated parking area, from School stall back to the staff parking area.
- After parking, accompany your child/ren to and from the school gate.
- Children should always exit the vehicle from the school side, not the roadside.

Kiss and Go Zone (Alternative Option)

- Located directly in front of the school gate.
- You may stop (not park) here to drop off or collect your child/ren.
- Stay in your vehicle this zone is for quick entry and exit only.
- One vehicle at a time in this zone.
- Do not double park or block any part of the driveway.
- Leave sufficient space for the school bus to park safely.

Wet Weather Procedure

- The Kiss and Go Zone remains in use during wet weather.
- Enter the car park and wait in the queue.
- Stay in your vehicle.
- Staff will bring your child/ren directly to your car.
- Proceed forward only when safe to do so, one vehicle at a time.
- Leave adequate room for the bus.

↑ Important Safety Reminders

- At pick-up time, please help keep the gate area clear and ensure your children stay with you once they are
 outside the gate. When 'catching up with other parents', please be mindful not to block the gate or
 pathways for others.
- · Do not park across the road from the school.
- U-turns in school zones are illegal.
- You may turn around at Nashua Road.
- It is permitted to turn south from the car park exit.
