Exploring the Living World

In Science, we have continued our exploration of the living world. We learned about what living things need to survive and took action by creating our very own egg heads - growing seeds in eggshells and observing the seedlings as they sprouted. To top it off, we had a fantastic excursion to the Byron Bay Wildlife Sanctuary. The animals were a huge hit, and we learned so much about how we can care for them both in the sanctuary and in the wild.

We have also brought the living world into our art projects! The students crafted beautiful turtles using paddle pop sticks and yarn, learning a weaving technique to create unique shells. We also took a bold dive into Pop Art, drawing inspiration from Andy Warhol. Our colourful final pieces are nearly complete and looking amazing!

The Whales Class has been learning about music on an app called Amplify over the past few weeks. We have been learning about rhythms, pitch, the importance of silence, beats and 4/4 sequence. Pitch is how high or low a musical sound is. It allows us to switch between different tones. Rhythm is a pattern of sound and silence. It creates movement, pulse and groove. We got to create our own rhythm sequences on the drums. A 4/4 sequence mostly refers to a time signature also referred to common time. We got to use different types of notes and silence to create different sequences on the drums and tambourines. A beat is the basic that defines the rhythm we learnt about, think of it like a heartbeat of music.
